Mary continues:

- The Bible tells us that in heaven there is neither sun nor moon to light the sky. Yet it is filled with a brilliant light, the glory of God. It is even more dazzling than the sun, and it is always there. In heaven, there is no night. Imagine that! No dark corners, no night, no fear of the scary things of the night. Mary speaks of heaven as if she had been there.

- In heaven, there will be no more tears! Many things here on earth make us cry: pain, illness... Has anything else ever made you cry?
- Yes, Grace answers sadly in a low voice, death, poverty, and also famine.

Mary continues:

- Failure at school, arguments, fights, wars and many other things. But in heaven, all that will be gone!

- Yes, that's right! That's exactly what I said! The Lord Jesus would also love for you to be in heaven with him one day. In fact, everyone is invited!

Suddenly, Mary's voice saddens:

- But there's a problem we haven't talked about yet. There's one thing that isn't in heaven. It's sin!

Mary turns the page of her little book and shows Grace a dark page.

- This is the saddest page in my book! This dark page represents the state of our hearts.

Our hearts and lives are dirty because of sin. Sin is anything that does not please God. And a person whose heart is soiled by sin cannot enter heaven.

The Bible tells us this in Romans 3, verse 23:

ALL HAVE SINNED AND FALL SHORT OF THE GLORY OF GOD.

- God's glory is heaven, explains Mary. Here, the Bible says that all men are sinners.

It's not only the people who have committed crimes that are sinners.

The Bible is not only speaking of "great sins" like theft, murder, or those sins worthy of prison.

No, God makes no difference between a great sin and a small one, because only just one sin separates us from God! And he says that everyone has sinned.


- Have you sinned too? Mary asks Grace.

Grace is silent for a moment.

- Yes, I lied... and several times I insulted my brothers... and I cheated at school... to get a better result, stammers Grace, guiltily.
- Me too, admits Mary. I've often disobeyed God, quarrelled with my colleagues, and other things worse than that as well.

Grace looks at her confounded, but says nothing as she waits for Mary to explain further.

- Because of our sins, we are separated from God. It's like a great, impassable barrier blocking our path to heaven.



- What misery! God loves us and invites us to heaven. The Lord Jesus offers us a place in heaven, but sin blocks our way and prevents us from getting there!

The Bible tells us in Romans 6, verse 23:

THE WAGES OF SIN IS DEATH.

- That means that you deserve death for your sins. Not only physical death, the death of your body, but also moral death, that is, eternal separation from God. And the one who dies with his sins will be cast into hell, a terrible place of fire that will never be extinguished.

But Mary continues quickly, as she meets Grace's anxious gaze, God does not want men to go to hell.

God made a way to save us from eternal death. Because God

loves you with a great love, he wants you to be with him in heaven one day.

Tomorrow, I'll tell you how to get there, Mary promises Grace.

Chapter 4

Grace sleeps very poorly once again. As she thinks about what Mary has told her, other things come to mind. Once, after an errand at the market, Grace remembers how she had not returned all the money back to her Mom. Now she realizes it was theft. And how many times had she quarrelled with her brothers, not to mention disobeyed her parents, especially lately when she'd always wanted to do as she pleased.

She understands that all these things are sins that separate her from God, and tonight they weigh like a very heavy burden on her conscience. Only now and then does she fall into a shallow, restless sleep.

Fortunately, Mary comes to see her early the next morning. It's her day off, but she has seen Grace's concern and wants to help.

- Today we have plenty of time to get on with our little book, she says gently, pulling it from her pocket.

She opens it again to the dark page:


- Yesterday we were left with the great barrier that separates sinful man from God.

We saw that sin blocks the way to heaven. Do you remember?

- Yes, agrees Grace.
- Faced with this sad situation, some people start to think and ask themselves how they can cross this barrier. After all, everyone wants to reach heaven one day.

So people start building bridges. One of them is called "church". Some men say that if you belong to a church and go to worship every Sunday, that's enough to get you to heaven. What do you think? Mary asks Grace.

- Yes, I think that should make it possible, Grace replies slowly, realizing how rarely she goes.
- No, responds Mary firmly, that's not good enough. The bridge is too short!
- It's good to go to church regularly, but it's not enough to be saved. Your father can even be a church elder; you can go every Sunday to worship, but that cannot save you!



There is also another bridge that people call "keeping God's Ten Commandments".

They say that if you keep the commandments, you will definitely make it to heaven. But that bridge is also too short!



Grace looks at Mary with a surprised and questioning look. Mary continues

- Tell me, do you always manage to keep God's Ten Commandments? For example, this one:

HONOR YOUR FATHER AND YOUR MOTHER.

- No, Grace answers honestly, I just can't do it.
- That's right, confirms Mary. No one can, no matter how hard they try. And the Bible says that if you have broken one commandment, you have broken the whole law. That's why I said that this path does not lead to heaven either.

Indeed, the Ten Commandments only condemn us, because they show us that we are incapable of pleasing God on our own.

But I want to show you yet another bridge that people build. It's called "good works".

These people think they have to do a lot of good works, and that in doing so they can make up for the sins that they have committed.

They imagine it works like the principle of a scale. On one side they put the sins, on the other side the good works. They think that if the two sides are more or less even, or better yet, if there are more good works than sins, God must accept them into heaven.

Have you ever heard of that? she asks Grace. Grace nods approvingly.

- But good works aren't enough to get you into heaven either, continues Mary. The Bible tells us so!



- You can strive to be kind to your neighbor, you can help the poor, visit the sick, tithe every Sunday... but all these good works will not save you! They are not enough to get you entrance into heaven!

Grace's astonishment grows as Mary continues her explanations.

- Even if you read a chapter of the Bible every day and recite the Lord's Prayer morning and night, it doesn't save you! And neither does baptism.

In short, all of our own efforts are not enough to get us to heaven! For they can never erase or cancel out the sins that separate us from God.

Chapter 5

Grace doesn't know what to think. If it is true that all of our efforts are useless in getting us to heaven, then how can we get there? She waits for Mary to continue. She turns another page in her little book and shows Grace a red page.

- Fortunately, God has prepared a way to lead us to heaven.


We have seen that we all have sinned and that, as a result, we all deserve death. God is holy and just, and he must punish sin. At the same time, God is love and does not want the sinner to die. God hates sin, but he loves the sinner.

God knows that there is nothing that you can do to get rid of your sins. But because he loves you, he has made a way for your sins to be forgiven.

This red page represents the blood of the Lord Jesus Christ. God so loved the world that he sent his own Son: Jesus Christ.

The Lord Jesus left heaven and came to earth to bear the punishment that we deserved for our sins. He was born to die on the cross.

Only the Lord Jesus could take this punishment for us. A sinful man could not die for another sinner to take away his sins.




But the Lord Jesus never committed a single sin, not in word, not in deed, not even in thought. And it was he, who had never done anything wrong, who had to die on a cross, as if he were a criminal. Because he was sinless, he was the only one who could die in our place.

Mary now gets more personal, addressing Grace:

- The Lord Jesus was crucified for my sins and for your sins. The Lord Jésus bore the judgment that you and I deserved. Because of his shed blood, God can forgive our sins.

So it was through the cross of the Lord Jésus that God provided the way for us to go to heaven!



- The Lord Jesus Christ himself is the way. Although the invitation to heaven way is open to everyone, you do not automatically go to heaven. You have to decide for yourself to choose God's way, through the Lord Jésus.

In the Gospel of John, chapter 14 verse 6, the Lord says:

I AM THE WAY, AND THE TRUTH, AND THE LIFE. NO ONE COMES TO THE FATHER EXCEPT THROUGH ME.

So now it's up to you, Grace, to decide whether or not you want to choose God's way. If you want to go to heaven, you have to believe that the Lord Jesus, the Son of God, died in your place, and bore the punishment you deserved for your sins.

If you decide to walk with him, you must confess your sins. Mary opens her Bible again and reads:

IF WE CONFESS OUR SINS, GOD IS FAITHFUL AND JUST TO FORGIVE US OUR SINS AND TO CLEANSE US FROM ALL UNRIGHTEOUSNESS.

1 John 1,9

She explains:

- Confessing your sins means telling them to God with regret and acknowledging your guilt. When you confess your sins, God will forgive you because his Son Jesus Christ died for your sins. So, the Lord Jesus Christ becomes your personal Savior.

So far, Grace has followed Mary's explanations attentively. However, she now seems to be deep in thought.

- Is there anything you don't understand? asks Mary.
- I've sinned a lot, says Grace in a low voice, but I'd love to go to heaven!
- So, have you understood what you need to do? Grace hesitates.

Mary hands her Bible.

- Read verse 9 of 1 John 1 for yourself and replace the "we" with an "I" or "me"!

Grace reads:

"If I confess my sins, God is faithful and just to forgive me my sins and cleanse me from all unrighteousness".

- So, what should you do? asks Mary.
- I have to confess my sins, replies Grace.
- Yes, tell God about them in prayer, sincerely regretting them, list all the sins you still remember. And what will God do, according to our verse? Grace reads the verse again, then answers in a firm, assured voice:
- Forgive me!
- Yes, he will forgive you because his Son Jesus Christ has already borne the punishment you deserved.

Chapter 6

If you confess your sins, he washes your heart, he makes it white, like this page. Mary turns another page in her little book and shows her the white page. With a heart like that, purified by the blood of Jesus Christ, you can enter heaven.



- Yes, replies Grace, wholeheartedly.
- So go to God now. You can talk to him anytime. You don't have to go to church to pray, you can do it wherever you are. Because of your broken leg, you can't kneel, but that's okay. Stay in bed, close your eyes and simply talk to God, telling him everything that's on your mind. Do you want to do this alone, or would you like us to pray together out loud? asks Mary.

A little embarrassed, Grace looks around. But most of the patients are asleep, and no one is paying them any attention.

- Let's pray together, she replies.
- Lord Jesus, begins Mary, you see Grace who is sad because of her sins, and who wants so much to be in heaven with you one day. Thank you that you died for her on the cross of Golgotha and that you want to forgive her. Amen.

After a moment of silence, in a voice at first hesitant, then increasingly sure, Grace prays:

- Lord Jesus, I've sinned a lot: I've lied, I've stolen money from Mom, I've cheated at school, I've insulted my brothers, I've fought with them and often I've disobeyed my parents...

Grace sighs, then continues:

- I regret all this terribly and I ask you to forgive me. Thank you, Lord Jesus, that you died for me on the cross and that you forgive me. Thank you that you wash my heart so that I can enter heaven. Amen.

When they open their eyes, a radiant smile lights up their faces.

- Now you've become a child of God, Mary explains. God has forgiven you and will never again reproach you for your sins. You no longer need to be afraid of death, for you are now on the way to heaven. God will receive you there, because your sins have been taken away by the blood of his Son, the Lord Jesus Christ.

Grace's face shines even brighter.

- Thank you so much for showing me your little book! Thank you for explaining the way to heaven!

I was so worried because of these questions, and ever since the young woman who was with me in the room died, I was so afraid of death, because I didn't know where I'd go next. But now, I know that one day I'll go to heaven! Grace says as she sighs with relief. Thank you so much!

Mary kisses Grace and gets up.

- I have to go now; I have some errands to run. But tomorrow I'll be back to see you, she promises. I'll bring you a New Testament - it's a part of the Bible - so you can read the stories of the life of the Lord Jesus to learn to know him and follow him better. See you tomorrow!

Chapter 7

Grace feels that everything around her has changed. Even the idea of having to stay in the hospital for several more weeks seems less difficult than before. It's as if a great burden has been lifted from her shoulders, and she can't wait to tell her mom all about it tonight.

When Grace's Mom arrives, she is tired and out of breath from the multitude of tasks she had around the house. To her surprise, though, she finds Grace beaming.

- How are you this evening? And what's going on? she asks with wonder.
- Very well, replies Grace. Now I know that I will go to heaven when I die.
- But what's wrong? What did the doctor say today? asks her mother worriedly, looking deep into Grace's eyes. I think you're getting better; you're not going to die!
- Yes, I'm fine, very fine in fact! But do you remember that young woman who died shortly after I arrived?

It scared me so much that ever since, I had been wondering where I would go if I were to die today too.

Over the past few days, one of the nurses has been visiting me regularly. With the help of her Bible and a wordless book, she explained to me the way to heaven.

I understood that I was lost because of my sins... and Mom, she continued lowering her voice, I also understood that I have sinned a lot against you. I often disobeyed, lied and even stole. I asked God to forgive me, and he did. Please, Mom, forgive me too!

Astonished, the mother looks at Grace without understanding. It's true, in the days before her accident, Grace caused her a lot of grief with her obstinate, disobedient behavior. So where does her attitude come from today? How happy she would be if Grace really did change her attitude and became a help around the house! But she doesn't get her hopes up.

A difficult life, full of work and disappointments, has made her somewhat bitter and distrustful. However, she loves her daughter and has suffered seeing her so down since her accident. - I forgive you, but I hope you'll really change!

Grace sighs as she realizes how much she has offended her mother in the past. Will I really be able to change my behavior? she asks herself.

The next day, when Mary arrives, she immediately notices that Grace is once again burdened with worries.

- Oh, Mary, thank you for coming so early! exclaims Grace. You know, when you left yesterday, I was so happy to know that God has forgiven me for all my sins and that one day I will be able to go to heaven.

I told Mom all about it and I also asked her forgiveness. She forgave me, but said she now wants to see a change in my life. And the more I think about it, the more I wonder if I can really stop sinning.

Mary smiles.

- Listen, she says, that's exactly what I want to explain to you today. My little book even has a green page on the subject.

Yesterday, I told you that you're now a child of God, you've been born again, and God has given you a new life.

From now on, you'll have to make sure you feed this new life. Do you know how you do that? By reading God's Word, the Bible. I have brought you a New Testament, it is yours to keep.

She hands it to Grace, who takes it with eyes shining with joy.

- Read a portion each day. It will help you get to know the Lord Jesus and God, who is now your heavenly Father. You will also find advice for your daily life. As soon as you understand something, put it into practice!

Grace nods with a smile.

- I want to start reading it right away. Here at the hospital, I've got lots of time!
- And there is another very important thing, continues Mary. Talk to the Lord Jesus every day in prayer. You can talk to him anywhere, at any time, about anything, just as you would with a friend. He is always ready to listen. Set aside time to pray, each morning when you get up and every evening, before you go to sleep.

Ask him to help you to live for him and to obey him. And ask him to give you the courage to witness for him.

It's great that you already started yesterday by telling your mom all about it. But don't be discouraged if your friends laugh or make fun of you. They'll be watching you, and the change they see in you will convince them. Isn't that what your mom told you?

- Yes, she said she wants to see a change in me, replies Grace, still worried.
- And she will see it, says Mary, convinced, because you now have this new life that wants to please the Lord Jesus. He will give you the strength to change.

But unfortunately, it's true that a child of God can still sin. It's not something normal, no, it's like an accident.

A sin doesn't change your position. You're still a child of God, and you don't need to be saved again.

However, your communion with the Lord Jesus will be interrupted. You will no longer feel the joy of being a child of God. To restore it, you must confess this sin as soon as possible.

Do you still remember our verse from yesterday? Try to find it yourself in your New Testament. The Epistles of John are near the end of the Bible, just before the Epistle of Jude and Revelation.

Grace searches, and soon finds John's first epistle, chapter 1, verse 9.

- Read this verse out loud, encourages Mary.
- Grace begins to read:

"If we confess our sins, God is faithful and just to forgive us our sins and cleanse us from all unrighteousness."

- You see, Mary explains, God has forgiven you all your sins once and for all, and he will never reproach you for them again. But if, unfortunately, you still sin, he forgives you too, because his Son Jesus Christ also bore the punishment for that sin.

But sinning will make you sad, because you'll feel there's something between you and God. That's why you need to confess it right away. Ask the Lord Jesus to help you not to fall into this sin again. He will certainly help you. Do you understand?

- Yes, a little. But I still have a lot to learn, sighs Grace.
- That's right! And as long as you're still here, I'll be visiting you regularly. That way, you can ask me all the questions you want, Mary reassures her. And then, I'm sure you will get to know other believers who can help you.

A child of God must not remain alone. It is good for him to join other children of God who love the Lord Jesus and follow him faithfully.

To grow in faith, it's important to attend Christian meetings regularly. Put your trust in the Lord Jesus, who will guide you and show you every step of the way.

In his Word, God gives you a great promise. Do you want to underline this verse in your New Testament so you never forget it again? It's found in Hebrews chapter 13, verse 5. It's the Lord Jesus saying to you:

I WILL NEVER LEAVE YOU NOR FORSAKE YOU.

So you will never be alone again, because the Lord Jesus wants to be your helper and advisor in all the circumstances of your life. Beautiful, isn't it?

- Oh yes, and it's as if I found a new friend, Grace replies happily.

Mary looks at her watch.

- Oh, it's already very late, I must leave you now, but don't forget that the Lord Jesus never leaves you!

After she leaves, Grace takes out her New Testament and reads the first chapter of Matthew's Gospel.

Then she clasps her hands together and closes her eyes:

- Lord Jesus, she says in her heart, I thank you once again for dying on the cross for my sins. Thank you for saving me! I want to follow you right now. Help me to understand what you tell me in your Word and to obey you. And thank you that one day I'll be with you in heaven. Amen.
